REPORTS

Superintendent Steven Sugg Reported:

- The school year is coming to an end. The last day of school is five weeks from tomorrow. We

are planning for end of year celebrations and graduation with multiple options due to COVID-19 restrictions.

- This past week was teacher appreciation week, thank you to our amazing certified staff for their hard work and dedication this school year. They were adaptable gracious and patient beyond belief.
- Certified negotiations ended in two sessions and we will soon begin negotiations with the classified union.
- The board work session and the vision and goals presented by the staff of both campuses went well. There is so much going on to the benefit of our students and working to improve outcomes.
- The ABC Foundation dinner and auction was a success even during the pandemic. I want to thank all of the staff who volunteered to make it possible. Heidi Lindell and the rest of the Foundation Board did an amazing job under very difficult and uncertain circumstances.
- Construction is continuing and we have saved some items for the Foundation auction in the future like the door to the safe in the grade school office and an old weather station from the grade school.
- Christopher Wytoski, Ann Coleman and Terri Paysinger toured the construction a couple of weeks ago. I am working with Paul Chamberlin to arrange another opportunity for the remaining board members to get a tour.
- We are still awaiting the final number for the State School fund for the next biennium. We budgeted at 9.2 billion. The current number in the legislature is 9.1 billion, while COSA and OSBA are lobbying for 9.6 billion. The next economic revenue forecast is due out on May 19, 2021.

Bond Update:

Superintendent Steven Sugg reported:

- The construction work revealed that there were several layers of ceiling in the High School career center, one layer containing asbestos requiring abatement.
- The construction is still on budget.
- The next phase is the planning of the move out at the end of the year for construction to move in.

Financial Report:

Debbie Diener, Business Manager shared the financials with the Board.

Administrator Reports

Grade School Principal Dana Symons reported:

- The Grade school is focusing on the end of the year. There will be some “normal” experiences that our students and staff will experience this year. We also have new activities and ideas for how to celebrate our students in a safe and socially distanced environment.
- There will be an end of year celebration day for each grade level. All students in a grade level will attend school together for one day. Special events and picnic lunches are on the agenda.
- Kindergarten celebration plans are being finalized. We want to offer an experience for all of our kindergarten students and their families to celebrate their growth and readiness to move into first grade.
- Outdoor school for fifth graders is a combination of outdoor school staff led zoom activities,

fifth grade teacher led activities, and a take home kit for each student containing supplies, journals, and field guides.

- Kindergarten and preschool roundups are happening this week and next. We are hoping to have a great and rather large group of new students for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Summer school plans are in the works. Our staff are dreaming big about fun and educational activities for our students to do over two weeks at the end of July and into August.
- None of these wonderful activities and events would be possible if not for the amazing, dedicated, knowledgeable, and caring teachers we have at Dayton Grade School.

Junior High/High School Principal Mike Solem reported:

- Graduation will take place on Saturday, June 5, 2021 at 2:00PM. Our risk level will determine what exactly graduation will look like, but our current plans are to have the seniors in the stadium and families on the football field at tables. The families will be sitting together at the designated table, which can sit six according to covid regulations. Staff will be on both sides of the tables. The idea is to have the ceremony and then have the graduated join their families for the proclamation.
- Eighth grade promotion will take place on June 7, 2021.
- The Junior High/High School will be hosting an open house on Thursday from 4:00-7:00 for anyone who wants to see the construction process. Each construction site has a video to show changes and architectural drawings.

Appoint Budget Committee Member

One application for the budget committee was received, Kathy Koball Miller, who has been a part of the committee in the past.

Dayton Education Association (DEA) Collective Bargaining Agreement

The Dayton Education Association and the Dayton School District office completed two negotiation sessions before reaching an agreement. The highlights of the bargaining agreement include district PERS pickup to make salaries more competitive, a 2-year contract, and insurance. Christopher Wytoski, Jeffrey Crapper, Ann Coleman and Terri Paysinger declared a conflict of interest and did not discuss this topic.

-It was moved by Terri Paysinger, seconded by Larry Ringnalda, and carried 7-0 to approve the DEA Collective Bargaining Agreement as proposed.

Approve Meal Prices / Student Fees

A draft of the 2021-2022 Meal Prices / Student Fees was shared with the board.

-It was moved by Terri Paysinger, seconded by Debbie Kearns, and carried 7-0 to approve the 2021-2022 Meal Prices/Student Fees as presented.

Second Language (Spanish) Curriculum Adoption

The foreign language department has not had a textbook adoption for more than 30 years. The books we are currently looking at purchasing are full of digital supplemental materials, which work perfectly with our 1:1 Chromebook program. The Mundo Real textbooks differ from others on the market in many ways. One of the most significant differences is age, as many of the current options are simply reprints of older textbooks, and the pictures and videos are dated. The Mundo Real textbooks are shorter than other textbooks but include extensive supplemental materials such as a virtual learning environment, video series, and audio series. These books are a drastic update from our current Dime textbooks, which were published in the early '90s and are outdated.

-It was moved by Jeffrey Crapper, seconded by Travis Oliveira and carried 7-0 to adopt the Second Language (Spanish) Curriculum "The Mundo Real"

Purchase of Skysail Modular

A recommendation from HMK was presented to the board for the purchase of a classroom modular from Modular Building Systems in the amount of \$110,200.00.

-It was moved by Debbie Kearns, seconded by Travis Oliveira to purchase a modular for skysail as recommended.


Meadowbrook Home Development Memo
